OUTREACH NEWS

April 2019

It is a time to count our blessings during Lent. We are not asking you to give up anything during Lent. Rather we are inviting you to contribute to the Eastern PA UMC camping ministries. Summer will be here soon and a week at camp can be transformative for youth. There are four camps supported by our conference: Carson Simpson Farm, Innabah, Gretna Glen and Pocono Plateau. The real cost of a week of camp per camper ranges from \$350 to more than \$500 per week, but reduced fees are available to families with the help of generous donors like us. If you would like to make a donation, please make a check payable to SUMC with a notation that it is for camping ministries.

Our final hosting of Grace Café for the season takes place on Sunday, April 7. Grace Café is an outreach ministry of Arch Street UMC in Center City Philadelphia. Every Sunday from September through June, Arch Street offers an evening worship service followed by a dinner free to all comers. They have been serving between 150-200 guests of an evening. Their congregation can only provide this ministry with the help of partnering congregations like ours. If you would like to serve dinner that evening, gather at SUMC at 4:15 p.m. so that we can carpool in to Philadelphia. Dinner is served at 6:00 and we are back in Swarthmore by 8:00 p.m. Please contact Janice Ciampa if you would like to participate or if you would like to make a donation of cash or needed food items.

PBJ Night will be on Wednesday, April 17 at 7:45 p.m. Sandwiches made benefit the Life Center of Eastern Delaware County in Upper Darby and City Team in Chester. Bring two loaves of sliced bread and we will provide the peanut butter and jelly.

The Chester/Delco Chapter of Heeding God's Call to End Gun Violence will be putting up the first 2019 Tee Shirt Memorial to the Lost on Saturday, April 6 at St. John Chrysostom in Wallingford, starting time to be determined. The Tee Shirt Memorial recognizes the deaths due to gun violence in Delaware County over the preceding five years. This year the Memorial will have 194 names, the highest tally to date.
