#### From the Pastor's Desk

Recently, Swarthmore made the national and international headlines for its racism. Yes, racism. I am unable to attribute an intentional racist act, the production and distribution of a xenophobic, hate-filled "comic" letter by high schoolers, to youthful indiscretion. I am also disheartened by the racially insensitive, whitewashed response to the letter made by some members of our community. Rather, this incident and the response to it revealed the pervasive, systemic, and persistent river of racism flowing through our community. You might have seen The Interfaith Council of Southern Delaware County's letter, which I signed, decrying this act of overt racism in the local newspapers. However, what is needed is not just a letter, but a long-term commitment to confront racism.

As your pastor, I am committing myself to doing the hard work of being a leader in confronting the racism in our community. As part of this commitment, I have applied to join the initial cohort of white pastors participating in a year-long anti-racist training program. The training is appropriately called "Whites Confronting Racism." This program, which arises out of our Annual Conference's commitment to dismantling racism in all its forms, is designed to prepare white pastors to seek racial justice in all aspects of their lives and to influence others to do the same.

The "Whites Confronting Racism" training is intense. Over the course of 2019, if accepted into the program, I will attend three progressive three-day, all-day training sessions, complete readings and assignments between each workshop, participate in a support group that meets at least once a month, and go to periodic evening sessions between workshops. However, if I am not accepted into the program, I will participate in other anti-racism training programs this year and apply again to the "Whites Confronting Racism" program the next time it is offered.

Engaging in this work complements our commitment to being an open and inclusive church that truly welcomes, embraces, and affirms all people. Engaging in this work will provide us the skills and tools needed to effectively confront racism. Engaging in this work will support us in our mission to transform the world into the beloved community of God.

I look forward to sharing this journey of intentional anti-racism ministry with you.
